STUDENT ASSIGNMENT:

- 1. The student will read the assigned text "Dare to Discipline." This assignment will count as 10% of your final grade.
- 2. Read a total of 600 pages from the suggested book list including the text. This assignment will count as 10% of your final grade.
- 3. Do a term project covering one of the topics discussed in this course. Use at least five sources from secular as well as noted Christian counselors. Evaluate the method used by each source to counsel children and explain what you like and dislike about the method. In addition, explain whether the method is Biblical and give your reasons with scripture to support your argument. Each source you choose should take no less than two type-written pages to complete. This assignment will count as 30% of your final grade
- 4. Do a 4 to 5 page critique on the text "Dare to Discipline." What points do you agree with and what points do you disagree with the author. List your arguments and back them up with scripture. This assignment will count as 20% of your final grade.
- 5. Do the following self-test. In the course outline answer the questions listed under sub-headings B through D. Each heading should take no less than two type-written pages with the total project equaling six to ten pages. You may use any of the abuse books as well as Martin Grants book on counseling children in your response to this self test. Check the Bible college or seminary library nearest you to find the books needed for this project. You can order these books through you local Christian book store if you wish to have your own copy. This project will count as 30% of your final grade.
